

# **Prima Cossa Boulangerie Donates Coffee Sales to Sacha's Park**

L'Original, ON - [Prima Cossa Boulangerie](#) has joined the growing list of local businesses supporting the effort to build an inclusive playground in L'Original. The family run restaurant and bakery, located at the L'Original court house, has donated the profits from its past year's coffee sales to help build Sacha's Park. Over \$659 was donated this past week to help purchase accessible equipment for the playground being built in memory of Sacha Chenier, a L'Original child who was unable to play in local parks due to disability and his use of a wheelchair.

Organizers of the playground project, which is slated to begin construction in early fall, say they are touched by the donation. *"We really appreciate Prima Cossa's contribution. They are a small family run business and to have them helping out like this means a lot"*, says Sacha's Park organizer Jason Chenier.

## **About Sacha's Park:**

A playground, to be known as Sacha's Park, is being proposed for the new Place La Seigneurie development in L'Original. The playground, once built, will be different than a typical playground in that it will be universally accessible allowing children of all abilities to fully enjoy the park and its equipment. The goal for Sacha's Park is to create a playground that is inclusive and where the equipment works for everyone, including children with disabilities. Sacha's Park will be a playground where EVERYONE can play. The Chenier family have purchased property which they are donating to the Township of Champlain for the park to be built on. The Chenier family are working in collaboration with the Township of Champlain to secure funding for the equipment, which will cost several hundred thousand dollars. Construction of the initial phase of the park is slated to begin in the early fall of 2016.

## **About Sacha Chenier:**

Sacha Chenier was an 11 year old boy who lived in L'Original, Ontario. He was severely affected by cerebral palsy and required the use of a wheelchair for most of his life. He was also born blind, epileptic, and with severe cognitive delays. Sacha required assistance for his daily care, as he was unable to do the most basic of tasks without help. He was lovingly cared for at home where he lived with his parents Jason and Jacquelyn and his older brother Sebastien. Despite his many challenges, Sacha was a happy little boy who loved to be around other children. He attended school in Hawkesbury at École Paul VI where he was loved by his many friends. Sacha always had a smile on his face

and his infectious laughter could brighten up a room. Sacha passed away suddenly on June 9th 2014 due to epilepsy related complications.
