

Flood Warning Update Kemptonville District – Ottawa River

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry's (MNR) Kemptonville District Office provides this **Flood Warning Update** for the residents along the north-eastern reaches of the Ottawa River in the District.

Residents living in the City of Clarence-Rockland, the Town of Hawkesbury, and in the Townships of East Hawkesbury and Champlain should stay away from fast-moving rivers and streams at this time of year and regularly check updated messages about spring weather conditions. Residents who live in an area that has a historic susceptibility to flooding should take appropriate precautions to protect their property, such as ensuring sump pumps are functioning and securing items that may be impacted should water levels rise.

Shorelines along streams and rivers are dangerous at this time of year. MNR advises all residents to keep their children, pets and themselves away from lakeshores and riverbanks.

MNR is closely monitoring spring weather and developing watershed conditions. Further updates will be issued as appropriate.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

This message is being sent on the basis of information received from the Ministry's Surface Water Monitoring Centre, the Ottawa River Regulation Planning Board, the Rideau Valley Conservation Authority, Environment Canada and from other sources of weather information.

Description of Current Conditions

The Ottawa River Regulation Planning Board (ORRPB) indicates that flood levels continue to slowly decrease on all sections of the main stem of the Ottawa River between Mattawa down to the Hawkesbury/Grenville area. This decline could be slowed due to forecast rainfall over the upcoming weekend; however, no significant releases from upstream dams are planned. Water levels are expected to further decrease throughout the coming week.

Risks:

Residents in low-lying areas are encouraged to continue to closely watch for updates in forecasts, and property owners experiencing flooding are encouraged to contact their local municipality for support.

Expiry Date:

This message will be in effect until (or updated before): 05/15/2017 5:00 PM.

Terminology: Notification Levels

WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT – WATER SAFETY: indicates that high flows, melting ice or other factors could be dangerous for such users as boaters, anglers and swimmers but flooding is not expected.

WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT - FLOOD OUTLOOK: gives early notice of the potential for flooding based on weather forecasts calling for heavy rain, snow melt, high winds or other conditions.

FLOOD WATCH: potential for flooding exists within specific watercourses and municipalities.

FLOOD WARNING: flooding is imminent or occurring within specific watercourses and municipalities.
